ALL ARE WELCOME. Quakers believe every person has unique value, and an Inner Light, which we call “that of God in everyone”. Women, men, children, persons of every race, age, and ability, of whatever condition in life, are welcomed equally.

A QUAKER MEETING for worship is based in silence: a silence of “expectant waiting”. It is an active silence in which each of us is trying to come nearer to one another and to God.

The **QUAKER FAITH BEGAN** in 17th century England. George Fox (1624-1691) searched for but did not find answers to his questions in the churches of his day. Out of George Fox’s seeking came the spiritual message which resulted in the formation of the Religious Society of Friends (Quakers).

One of the most important Quaker messages is that religion, or belief, is experiential. It is not a matter of accepting words or practices, but of experiencing God directly for oneself. We have no clergy, order of service, creed, or sacraments because Friends feel that no intermediary is needed between the individual and God.
